Listening Guide

Gershwin: Piano Prelude No. 1

DATE OF WORK: Published 1927 (in set of Three Preludes)

FORM: Loose ternary (A-B-A')

TEMPO: Allegro ben ritmato e deciso (Fast, rhythmic, and decisive)

WHAT TO LISTEN FOR: Energetic, syncopated first theme, with expressive blue note.

Highly rhythmic and accented accompaniment.

Overall 3-part structure (A-B-A').

Sweeping high-range lines build to climax in last section.



A section

Short, free introduction; slowing, then main theme, with lowered 7th-scale degree. Quick tempo set with syncopated chords and offbeats.

 $Theme\ 1\ accented\ and\ syncopated:$



B section

Begins softly with theme that rises a $4 \mathrm{th}$ (or sometimes a $5 \mathrm{th}$), followed by repeated pitches over syncopated accompaniment:



Development of $\, B \,$ theme, leads back to $\, A. \,$

A' section

Return of opening theme, with variations; final glissando to closing chord.
