## Listening Guide

Revueltas: Homenaje a Federico García Lorca, Third Movement, Son

DATE OF WORK: 1937

MEDIUM: Chamber orchestra (piccolo, E-flat clarinet, 2 trumpets, trombone, tuba,

piano, percussion, 2 violins, and bass)

FORM: Sectional, rondo-like (A-B-A-C-A-C-B-A-C-Coda)

OVERVIEW: I. Baile (Dance)

II. Duelo (Sorrow)

III. Son



Unusual instrumentation, focused on winds along with 2 violins, piano, and bass.

Colorful, folklike character, with themes reminiscent of mariachi ensembles.

Strongly rhythmic and syncopated, with percussive accents; use of ostinatos.

Return of 3 thematic ideas in a rondo-like structure.

A section—rhythmic and highly syncopated, in shifting meter; 7-note melodic turns in piano and violins, with glissandos in violins (Violin I shown):



 ${f B}$  section—piano and string ostinato introduces chromatic solo trumpet melody (accompanied by trombone):



A section—rhythmic punctuations, as in introduction.

C section—Mexican dance theme (son,) in alternating meter (6/8 and 2/4); muted trumpets playing in parallel thirds:



Trumpets answered by violins and woodwinds.

 $Development\ of\ rhythmic\ figure\ from\ above,\ in\ low\ brass\ (tuba),\ answered by\ woodwinds,\ then\ trumpets.$ 

Brief return of  ${\bf A}.$ 

Return of Mexican tune (C section), in full orchestra.

Rhythmic figure from  ${\bf C}$  developed.

B section—return of slow trumpet melody, with trombone countermelody.

A section-return of opening section.

C section—mariachi melody in violins, trumpet offbeats.

Grows dissonant.

Coda—cluster chord in piano, then fast, loud, frenetic.
