# Listening Guide

Gottschalk: The Banjo (Le banjo: Fantasie grotesque)

**DATE OF WORK:** 1854-55

GENRE: Fantasy

FORM: Five-part form (A-B-A-B-A) and coda

MEDIUM: Solo piano

WHAT TO LISTEN FOR: Highly syncopated rhythms; regular 4-measure phrases.

Imitation of banjo strumming and picking.

Bass-line melodies, alternating with high-range, embellished tunes.

Alternation of two sections, (a + b), plus coda. Suggestion of Camptown Races tune in coda.

Brief, syncopated introduction, in octaves in both hands (8 measures).

 $Rhythmic\,idea, in\,bass\,range\,of\,piano;\,repeated\,in\,\,4-measure\,phrases;\,decorated\,with\,flourishes:$ 



Simple, rocking-bass melody heard, and repeated.



Fast-paced, high-range melody, marked brilliant; syncopated against regular bass:



4-note descending pattern repeated, then glissando.

#### A section

Return to  ${\bf A}$  section.

Slow, rocking-bass melody.

#### B section

Fast, high-range melody returns.

 $4\hbox{-note descending idea, followed by gliss ando.}\\$ 

### A section

Opening rhythmic idea.

Rocking-bass melody.

## Coda

Camptown Races tune heard, in simplified rhythm.

Tune heard an octave higher and faster.

Speed increases to closing high flourish, then final  $\mathit{fortissimo}$  chord.
